

TIPS FOR PLANTING TREES AND SHRUBS



- *Keep newly purchased plants moist and in the shade until planting.*
- *Hole should be dug 2-4 inches shallower than the root ball.*
- *Remove ALL containers, wires, ropes, and pull back burlap, without disturbing the root ball before backfilling holes.*
- *Only prune dead and diseased branches out of newly planted trees and shrubs.*
- *Don't over water.*
- *The ideal planting time is early spring as soon as the ground can be worked before buds on the tree break dormancy.*
- *Mulching with wood chips after planting reduces need for frequent watering. Watering after planting is very important.*
- *The number one cause of death to newly planted trees is lack of winter watering....so remember to water in the winter as well as the summer.*

WATER CONSERVING TIPS

There are 7 principles of xeriscaping that apply to establishing a new landscape in Colorado. If you follow these rules you will conserve water and maintain a successful home landscape.

1. Develop a well-designed plan.
2. Reduce turf and high water areas.
3. Use a reasonable approach to soil improvements through soil amendments and aeration.
4. Select and use appropriate plant material for the climate, site, and soil.
5. Use mulch around trees and plants to improve moisture retention, reduce weak competition, and improve aesthetics.
6. Use sound watering practices by ensuring irrigation efficiency, modifying watering methods for slopes and low spots, watering at night or in the early morning, avoiding watering of sidewalks and driveways etc.



SPECIES RATING	
"A"	A highly recommended tree for Brighton. Trees on this list have minimal insect problems, and are well adapted for our soil and climate
"B"	Trees on list are generally recommended for Brighton. There may be <u>minor</u> problems associated with these species.
"C"	Trees on this list are suitable trees for Brighton but may have one or two <u>major</u> issues associated with the species.
"D"	Trees on this list are generally not recommended for most of Brighton's landscapes due to poor characteristics under most circumstances.
"F"	Trees on this list are not recommended whatsoever for Brighton. Trees on this list are either on the noxious weed list and/or cannot be found in the nursery trade due to their poor characteristics.
