# **SIGNIFICANT EVENTS**

---

### Case Report 23-0593

On Feb. 2 around 9:30 p.m., officers were on routine patrol in the area of Walmart when they noticed a suspicious vehicle with an obscured license plate leaving the parking lot and heading eastbound onto Bromley Lane. The officers initiated a traffic stop and contacted two individuals in the vehicle, a male and a female. They were in possession of drug paraphernalia, what appeared to be burglary tools, 5.47 lbs of marijuana and a loaded firearm. Both individuals are prohibited from possessing firearms due to previous crime convictions. The male was also found to be in violation of a protection order. Both the male and female were arrested, processed and transported to Adams County Detention Facility.

### Case Report 23-0633 and 23-0637

On Feb. 4, officers conducted a traffic stop on Hwy 85 and Bromley Lane. Through the stop and investigation, officers arrested multiple individuals for various charges including driving under restraint, possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of a controlled substance, tampering with evidence, criminal possession of a financial device and outstanding warrants.

### **THIS WEEK'S CRIME PREVENTION TIP**
