## SECTION 1

# SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

---

### Case Report 23-0716

On Feb. 8 at about 1 p.m., Officers were dispatched to a disturbance at Walmart. The victim reported being at the Adams County Courthouse, filing for a restraining order against her ex-boyfriend. When she returned to her vehicle parked in the parking lot, she noticed her ex-boyfriend was being dropped off. She got into her truck and locked the doors while her ex-boyfriend jumped in the bed of her truck and demanded she let him into the vehicle. The victim refused to allow the male into the truck and repeatedly asked him to get out. The male told the victim to drive him to Walmart, and he would get out and leave her alone. She drove to Walmart, and on the way there, she called 911. The male could hear the phone call because of the Bluetooth in the truck and began yelling at the victim. Once at Walmart he did get out of the bed and tried to get into the cab of the truck but couldn't because the doors were locked. The male punched the driver's side window, causing it to shatter. The male ran across the highway where he was taken into custody by officers. Additional officers met with the victim and connected her with victim services. The officers also helped the female tape up her window as a temporary fix.

### Case Report 23-0722

On Feb. 8 at about 2 p.m., Officers were dispatched to Bromley Lane and South 4th Avenue on reports of a reckless driver. The callers advised a truck was weaving in and out of traffic, nearly wrecking into other motorists. Dispatch also advised the driver was driving on sidewalks and callers believed the driver was drunk. Officers located the truck driving in a field in the area of South 27th Avenue and Bromley Lane. The driver was intoxicated and several empty White Claws were scattered throughout the truck's cab. The male driver was arrested for DUI and reckless driving and transported to the police department for processing. While at the police department, the male became combative and began punching and kicking the cell doors. He also attempted to remove the security camera in the holding cell forcefully. He refused to cooperate with officers, so they had to deploy pepper spray to gain control of the drunk driver. He was eventually booked into Adams County Jail.

### Case Report 23-0774, 23-0776, 23-0777, 23-0780

The officers working the evening of Feb. 10 into the early morning hours of Feb. 11 had four separate warrant arrests in one night.

### Case Report 23-0789

On Feb. 11, Officers took a report of a social media scam from Brighton East Farms. The 15-year-old victim started communicating with an unknown person on social media, and during their conversation, they exchanged photographs. The unknown person demanded the victim to send money via gift cards, cashapp, and other money-sharing platforms. This is a common scam where criminals befriend unsuspecting people and share intimate photos only to extort victims out of money later.

### Case Report 23-0781

On Feb. 11, Officers were dispatched to the McDonald's on South Kuner Road after receiving reports that a device was left behind that appeared to be a bomb. The responding officers set up a perimeter around the McDonald's and evacuated the employees. Officers also contacted neighboring bomb technicians to respond to the scene to help investigate. Officers identified the device as an electric capacitor left by maintenance personnel, not a threat. The officers allowed employees back into the building.
