SECTION 1: SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

Case report 25-6910: On December 15th, at around 4:40 p.m., officers responded to a motorcycle versus vehicle crash with injuries in the area of 12th Ave and Bridge St. While traveling westbound on Bridge St, the motorcyclist, a 25-year-old male, struck the vehicle as it was turning left in front of him. The male suffered a broken arm and injuries to his face. The rider was transported to Platte Valley Medical Center for further care and evaluation by Brighton Fire Rescue. The driver of the vehicle, a 64-year-old female, was cited and released on scene. Both the motorcycle and the car were towed. This is being investigated by the Traffic Safety Unit.

Case report 25-6976: On December 18th, at around 2:10 a.m., while on proactive patrols, officers observed a possible DUI driver in the area of Bridge St and Main St. The vehicle drove onto Highway 85, and officers conducted a traffic stop near East 144th Avenue and U.S. Highway 85. After officers conducted the DUI investigation, the driver was placed into handcuffs and seated in the back of the patrol vehicle. Simultaneously, a 2022 Nissan Murano driven by a 26-year-old female struck the other vacant patrol vehicle, with the driver fleeing the scene. She was soon located by the Colorado State Patrol near 965 Platte River Boulevard. The female was intoxicated, arrested for DUI, and booked into Adams County Detention Facility on multiple charges related to the crash.

Case report 25-7009/10: On December 20th, at around 2:20 a.m., while on proactive patrols, officers observed a vehicle traveling southbound on Main Street without headlights. The vehicle made a U-turn in the middle of the roadway and pulled into the Mobil 1 Gas Station, 725 South Main Street. Officers conducted a traffic stop, but the vehicle took off southbound on Main Street. The vehicle then ran through a red light at Hwy 85 and W. Bromley Ln, continuing westbound. A few minutes later, officers were dispatched to the 900 block of Canary Court, where a vehicle was driving on the green belt and had hit a tree. Officers responded and found it was the same vehicle that had eluded officers earlier. The driver, a 48-year-old male, was very intoxicated. Several citizens were with him, so he wouldn't flee. The male was taken into custody and transported to the Brighton Police Department, where he chose to take a breath test. The test showed that his Breath Alcohol Content was above the legal limit of 0.08. He also had 3 prior DUI convictions. He was booked into Adams County Detention Facility on multiple DUI-related charges as well as eluding.

Case report 25-7020: On December 20th, at around 6:35 p.m., officers responded to the area of West Bromley Lane at Platte River Blvd, for a 33-year-old male who barricaded himself in a building. When arriving on scene, officers were able to get the employees out safely and talk with the male. Thanks to our diligent teams, the male safely exited the building. The male was placed into custody and taken to the hospital for further care and evaluation.
